- A visit at the Museum of Vancouver titled 'Canoes an interview with Nooksack master carver George Swanaset' & 'We Were So Far Away: The Inuit Experience of Residential Schools'
- A lunch break at Kitsilano Beach & a guided exploration of Granville Island.

It is truly wonderful to see all of us engaging in greater measure with the characteristics that make "being in school" fun and so rewarding for all. And ... in one week it will be the longest day of the year. We will hope for brilliant sunshine and a lovely heat. We truly welcome Summer.

The Spring semester Activity Day will take place in July, with a focus on Cultus Lake in the eastern Fraser Valley. This is expected to be an extraordinary day. From June 13 to 17, the school conducted one week of the provincial assessments. This was the last session of the 2021–2022 school year. We wish the very best of results to those who wrote. Results should be known by the end of July.

Faculty continues to refine, elaborate and extend its expertise with uses of the varied approaches to academic inquiry. The entire BC school program, including the Graduation Program, is no transitioned to the 'new' BC curriculum with its emphasis on collaborative inquiry and research. This provinciallyinitiated revitalized approach to academics is complemented by the inclusion of First Peoples' Principles of Learning, and an increase in the use of peer and self-assessment as a means by which students may gage their progress.

The school has just published the Spring 2022 midterm report. Teachers, the counsellor and the principal are looking forward to meeting virtually, on Thursday June 23 with students' families, custodians, friends and agents to discuss student progress.



BULLETIN TO THE SCHOOL COMMUNITY

Covid19, its variants, and continued vigilance

From a BC Public Health perspective, it is acknowledged that the original threats rooted in December 2019 are largely behind us as we transition our behaviors from pandemic to endemic. Nonetheless, 'it' is not over ... We must continue our vigilance.

I confirm that Pattison High School has a large supply of Rapid Tests, enough to provide immediately for anyone who wants to do so. They may also elect to test before period 1 and after period 4.

Although the BCCDC advises that a person is considered to be 'clear' of viral infection following a 5 day self-isolation, it may be more reassuring for the school community to have returning students – and staff and Faculty - continue with the masking protocol for a further 5 days, following the return, so that the learning community feels more secure.

I have told everyone that they may conduct the test in my office, in order to have a measure of privacy when doing so.

Anyone who suspects to be viral symptomatic, or otherwise unsure of health status, must follow pandemic level protocol with the masking behaviour until the individual health status is confirmed.

Indigenous People's Day Field Trip: June 21





CHESS CLUB




